PRESIDENTS REPORT 2007

This completes my third and final year as President and it is an honour to report on our achievements over the year.

I thank the management team of David Black, Ian Ashe, Eddie Cowell and Col Cameron for their input during what has been a very busy and challenging year.

Queensland is in a healthy state being now the principal State for Radio Sailing in Australia.

That numbers continue to grow is a credit to the work put in by the respective Club Committees and members.

The momentum achieved from the successful hosting of the IOM Worlds by Mooloolaba in 2005 and the more recent 2007 Nationals at Lake Kurwongbah is continuing to help growth particularly in the South Eastern corner.

While the IOM Class continues to prosper with 42 entries at the last Qld IOM Championship, the level of interest in the M and 10R Classes continues to be a concern.

The impact of the recent Nationals saw a number of new A Class boats being built or purchased and we now have the nucleus of an A Class fleet with the possibility of a Queensland Championship for the class being held later in the year.

Queensland skippers led the way in representing Australia in International events with four of the team of seven representing us at the Marblehead Worlds in UK and three Queenslanders being the only Australian representatives at NZL2006 an International regatta for EC12's in New Zealand.

A number of IOM skippers also competed in NZ events.

Publicity Officer Eddie Cowell's professional web site continues to keep the sport in the public eye with excellent coverage of most events conducted throughout the state. If your clubs events don't rate a mention it is because nothing was submitted. Eddie is keen to publicise all events and would like results reports and pictures promptly after the event.

The major highlight was the successful running of the ARYA Nationals held over a thirteen day period in January. This was hosted by the Pine Rivers Club and strongly supported by Mooloolaba, Brisbane, Gold Coast, Wynnum/Manly and North Lakes who helped resource the Organising Committee and provide staffing for the event. Without this strong support from the various Clubs the event would not have been successful.

Congratulations to Bill Clancy who was awarded the George Middleton Trophy for the most significant contribution to Radio Sailing in Queensland in 2006.

As this completes my third year as President after a period in the Vice Presidents position I believe now is the time to step aside and allow a new incumbent with fresh ideas to take the organisation forward. I will still of course be continuing in my current role with the ARYA as Queensland's only representative on the Executive for the foreseeable future.

I thank the QRYA Executive, Member Clubs and individual members for the help and friendship given to me over this time that has made the job so rewarding.

VICE PRESIDENT / MEASUREMENT COORDINATOR REPORT ... 2007

I have been fortunate in being able to attend two of the three Management Meetings during the year now ending made possible through frequent visits to Brisbane for family reasons and my ultimate permanent move here in December.

As VP I have not had duties other than to attend meetings and help with decision making to enable the day to day progress of Queensland model yachting. Graeme Turk has kept us all on the right path and I congratulate him and his multi club committee on the very successful staging of the National Championships over two weeks in January. I am sure the competitors that just turn up to sail and go home at the end of the regatta do not realise what goes into the many hours of planing to stage such an event. Well done everyone. On a personal level Graeme has been a strong leader and has set the pace for his successor whoever that may be. His three years at the helm have certainly kept Queensland at the forefront of Australian model yachting. Congratulations Graeme on your excellent leadership.

Since the decision was made to review the check measurement system after major regattas every club measurer, bar one, has complied with the requirement to forward the check sheet details to me. This enables a close eye to be kept on wayward skippers and also encourages club measurers to be more diligent in their checking.

The system seems to be working as there are very few incidents of non-conformity. I see no reason to alter the present routine and look forward to it's continuation during the next twelve months.

Problems, there have been none, so I can only assume that club measurers are confident in their knowledge of the class rules and the requirements affecting the measurements of boats and sails. Not one measurer has referred anything to me for clarification or interpretation. Further to this topic the AYRA is currently considering the issue of a measurement guide for the four international classes probably in the form of a DVD or CD. The proposal is to provide a guide and all documentation required, in kit form, and including an open book test for measurers to confirm their understanding of the rules. It is to be an accreditation test. This should ensure that all clubs anywhere in Australia are following the same procedure.

I wish retiring committee members well for the future and the new team for 2007-2008 success for their decisions made for the future of Queensland model yachting.

SECRETARY'S REPORT 2006/2007

The past year of radio yachting in Queensland has passed very quickly, there always being an event to keep skippers in the competitive mood and improve their tuning and sailing skills.

The coming year is to be comparatively quiet as there are no World or National Championships to be held in Queensland as there has been over the previous two years.

Queensland played host to the Australian National Championships in January this year. Six South Queensland clubs combined to man the event that was sailed at Lake Kurwongbah, the Pine Rivers Radio Yacht Club being the host club. The event was well organised and is a credit to the host and the other involved clubs.

In the latter part of 2006, Queensland skippers put in good performances at the World RM Championship in the UK. IOM skippers are now competing for ranking points to get a spot in the Australian team going to the Worlds IOM Championship in France later this year.

One Metre sailing is still by far the most popular class in Australia at present and looks like continuing to do so in the foreseeable future. Entries for the Queensland 2007 championship are coming in and a large fleet is expected for the event being hosted by the Mooloolaba Radio Yacht Club

The Various State and District Championship for this calendar year are well under way with the Queensland RM Championship and other district events already being concluded.

Two new clubs joined the Association last year. The first was the Twin Towns Radio Yacht Club sailing at Bonora Point just south of the Border whilst the other club, the Paradise Radio Yacht Club sails at Emerald Lakes at Carrara on the Gold Coast. This now brings the Association's Member Clubs up to sixteen.

Registration Cards for 2007/2008 have been ordered for all clubs whose fees have been received up to the 4th.May and will be valid until the 30th April 2008. Provided there are no hold ups with the printing, these cards should be available by the end of May. The printing order has not been delayed until all clubs had paid their subscriptions, as has been the case in previous years.

Club memberships for 2006/2007 were again a record reaching 274 registrations and this year registrations are already at 199 but which is a lower figure than last year's at this same time.

After the Nationals there was considerable criticism on the behavior of many skippers at the event of not voluntarily doing penalties because they had not been caught and called to do so. At the instigation of Jeff Byerley, The Brisbane Radio Yacht Club is holding "Jeff's Sail to Rules Days" the object not needing any explanation. Also, because there are no clubs south of Brisbane catering for RMs, BRYC is to hold sail days especially for RM and 10rs in an effort to get numbers of these boats, especially RMs back on the water.

The Championship and Major Events Calendar is full again this year. Skippers can expect to be sailing at the various venues around the state and the Association will continue to improve and grow as the next operational year progresses.

TREASURER'S REPORT 2006/2007

The Auditor's Report for the 2006/2007 financial year, the Statement of Income and Expenditure and the Bank Conciliation document were not available due to the Auditor being out of Brisbane for the past three weeks. Available at the meeting will be the Itemised Income, Expenses and Petty Cash Spreadsheets for inspection by Club representatives at the meeting. Copies can be sent to clubs requesting same with the minutes of the AGM.

The Auditor's Report and Financial Statements when they become available will be included in these minutes as separate documents and will follow this report.

The Income Spreadsheet gives full details of all income and expenditure for the year. Expenditure is detailed separately on the Expense Spreadsheet and all Petty Cash transactions are detailed on the Petty Cash Spreadsheet.

Total funds at the start of the year were \$8139.98 in the bank and a further \$48.69 in Petty Cash making a total of \$8188.67. Total funds at the end of the year were \$ 10,146.26 in the bank and a further \$26.34 in the Petty Cash tin making a total of \$ 10,172.60. Net income for the year was \$1983.93

The largest expense for the year was to the ARYA amounting to \$4277.00 and which represents a payment for 329 members. It is expected that a similar amount will be paid to the ARYA for the forthcoming year. The total membership for the year was 274 which is the highest recorded to date for any one year. The other 55 members were the overlap of those members that were registered before the end of the preceding year but whose ARYA fees were paid at the start of the New Year. A payment of \$2587.00 is to be made to the ARYA for members fees at the start of the QRYA 2007/2008 financial year.

The Fixed Assets list is included which shows the depreciated values of QRYA equipment as of the 30th.April 2007. The second hand Photo Coping machine which has served the Association well for 11 years has broken down and is in need of parts and a service. As it is anticipated that repair costs will be well in excess of its current market value, it is not used very much because of the QRYA printing needs can be met with the current printer, it has been decided to write it off and dispose of the machine. This will then make the total value of the QRYA Fixed Assets as \$ 753.00

The Management Committee has decided that fees for the forthcoming year will remain as is unless there is an extraordinary occurrence that may necessitate an early review of the fee's structure.

My procedures include examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the financial report. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion as to whether, in all material aspects, the financial report is presented fairly in accordance with the cash basis of accounting whereby income is recorded when it is received, expenses are recorded when they are paid, and no assets or liabilities, other than cash and bank balances, are recorded. Statements of Accounting Concepts and Accounting Standards are not applicable to the cash basis of accounting adopted by the Queensland Radio Yacht Association Inc.

The audit opinion in this report has been formed on the above basis.

Audit Opinion

In my opinion, the financial report presents fairly in accordance with the cash basis of accounting, as described above, the income and expenditure of the Queensland Radio Yacht Association Inc. for the year ended 30th April 2007 and its cash and bank balances at that date. 2006-2007 QRYA PUBLICITY OFFICER'S REPORT

While the QRYA continues to maintain its own website, its function is aimed more towards keeping our members in contact with the executive. Therefore, the primary avenue for publicizing our sport in Queensland with regular updates continues to be my personal webpage at www.rcyachts.net and since last year's report visitors to the site have increased by almost thirty thousand (30,000). The daily trend shows on average some 80 individual visitors, viewing in excess of 140 pages with Tuesday being the busiest day! During the past 12 months over one hundred (100) individual items have also been posted on the *rcyachts* site (see table below).

Some time was spent on re-developing both the Gold Coast Radio Yacht Club and RYSA websites and developing a new site for the newly formed Paradise Radio Yacht Club, while the Pine Rivers Radio Yacht Club had a specifically dedicated site developed for the National's which they hosted in January.

Clubs seem to be making better use of the online entry facility this year and are also sending me more results, reports and photos from regattas that they have hosted. Nevertheless there is always room for improvement and I must stress that regular and timely updates on the site are an integral part in keeping the general membership and members of the public interested in the sport/webpage and ensuring that they will visit again on a regular basis. With the diversity of clubs so widely spread out throughout our State, it is also important that each club takes responsibility for their own publicity through their local media outlets but with the view of utilizing *rcyachts* as the common focal point for State Wide, National and International skippers.

• Again, it cannot be emphasized enough, the power of the 'net and the importance of following through on timely regatta results, reports and photos – *there is nothing more frustrating than visiting a site with stale, out-of-date information and broken links!* It is impossible to name everyone who has contributed to the website over the past year individually, but please accept this as my personal thanks.

I must thank the QRYA executive for their continuing support and I would also like to wish outgoing President Graeme TURK well for the future – *hope to see you on the water more often in the coming year Graeme!*
