1. EVENT SCHEDULE

Ranking event for Marblehead (R.M) class yachts. 11th and 12th of November Saturday 11th briefing 10.30am Start 10.45 finish 4.00pm Sunday 10.00 start till 2.00pm. 2.30pm presentation

2. VENUE

PATAWALONGA BASIN, Glenelg North Anderson Ave Adelaide South Australia

3. ORGANISING AUTHORITY

The **Championships** are organised under the overall authority of the Australian Radio Yachting Association (Incorporated) (ARYA) and conducted by the South Australian Radio Yachting Association Inc, hosted by the Adelaide Radio control Yacht Racing Club Inc. and its duly appointed Race Committee.

4. RULES

The regatta will be governed by The ISAF Racing Rules of Sailing for 2005-2008 (RRS) as changed by Appendix E of the RRS - Radio Controlled Boat Racing Rules, this Notice of Race (NoR), the Sailing Instructions (SI), International Class Administration Rules, the Equipment Rules of Sailing (ERS) and the respective International Class Rules. The Sailing Instructions shall prevail in the event of conflict with this Notice of Race.

5. ELIGIBILITY

The competition is open to financial members of ARYA (Inc) affiliated clubs and to members of a recognized Division Member of the International Sailing Federation-Radio Sailing Division. All yachts must have a current registration certificate for the class entered.

6. REGISTRATION

Boats, together with their current registration certificate, must be presented for registration and check-measurement by 10.30am Saturday on the first day of competition for that class. No boat will be eligible to race until it has completed this process.

7. EVENT CATEGORY AND ADVERTISING

The Championships are classified under the ISAF Advertising Code Regulation 20.3.1 (b) as Category C.

The Organisers reserve the right to advertising according to Regulation 20.3

8. SCORING AND RACING SYSTEM

The current Heat Management System (HMS) as approved by the ISAF-RSD will be used. Where there are less than 16 competitors, the event will be sailed in one fleet.

9. MEASUREMENT

The Race Committee may direct that all boats entered in the event be check-measured or alternatively randomly select a number of boats for check measurement.

Random spot checks may be conducted throughout the duration of the event.

10. FREQUENCIES

Each competitor is required to nominate a minimum of three (3) frequencies with their entry. The listing of additional frequencies if available would be helpful. **Permitted frequency bands are 27, 29, 36 and 40Mhz.**

11. PROTESTS

A Committee will be appointed to hear any protests arising from the event and may comprise competitors not involved in the incident. RRS 61.2 and 62.2 may be replaced by a verbal notification and hearing if all parties affected by the incident agree.

The ISAF-RSD System for the Reduction of Protest Hearings (SYRPH) (Jan 1999) will apply to all protests.

Email entries will be accepted but will be considered as a commitment to pay the entry fee.

Entries will not be accepted from members who are un-financial at the close of entries.

The entry fee of \$50.00 (includes dinner Saturday evening add \$30 for additional guest attending the dinner) must accompany the entry form. Cheques made payable to A.R.C.Y.R.C.Inc and marked "Not Negotiable". Please do not send cash. A B.B.Q. Lunch will be available for purchase on both days as well as light refreshment during both days. There will be a dinner on the Saturday evening at the Royal South Australian Yacht Squadron there will a presentation of vane sailing boats.as well as a great night of discussion and fun for all.

Late entries may be accepted until 8TH of November on payment of an additional fee of \$ 10.00.

13. PRIZES AND TROPHIES

Prizes for first three place getters. The winner of the event will have their name engraved on the original Trophy and will receive a suitable trophy that they will retain. The Bourneville Trophy will be held in safe keeping by the South Australian association

A prize will be awarded to the highest placed South Australian place getter.

A prize will be awarded to the competitor with the oldest boat

A prize will be awarded to the best sportsperson
